APHIDS & PSYLLIDS (SUBORDER: STERNORRHYNCA)

Small in size (~1-3 mm) and soft pear-shaped bodies with longer legs & antenna. May have wings held vertically over the back.



FLIES (ORDER: DIPTERA)

Caterpíllars Count! 🕖

One pair of functional membranous wings with distinct veins; highly variable in shape, size and color.



TRUE BUGS (SUBORDER: HETEROPTERA)

Caterpíllars Count! 🥠

Semi-transparent wings overlap to form a triangle or "X" shape on the back (absent in nymphs). Sometimes pointy "shoulders".



BEETLES (ORDER: COLEOPTERA)

Caterpíllars Count! 🧭

Hardened wing casings that meets to form a straight line down the back.



BEES & WASPS (ORDER: HYMENOPTERA)

Two pairs of wings (hind wings smaller) and a narrow waist. Some parasitoid wasps are very slender and only 2-5 mm.



TRUE HOPPERS (SUBORDER: AUCHENORRHYNCA)

Caterpíllars Count! 🍞

Body cylindrical or with body tapering from head to abdomen; wings folded tentlike over the back. Nymphs lack wings.
